1) Science

National Curriculum Objective – Pupils should be taught to: identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees Pupils should be taught to: identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

Key knowledge/skills – To identify and name the parts of a tree and the parts of a plant.

Activity – Children to label the parts of a tree and the parts of a plant on the diagram.

2) Art

National Curriculum Objective – To know about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Key knowledge/skills – To identify William Morris the person and a piece of William Morris art. To identify William Morris art as a repeating pattern.

Activity: To complete the questions on the activity sheet and draw a piece of William Morris inspired art which includes a repeating pattern.

3) Computing

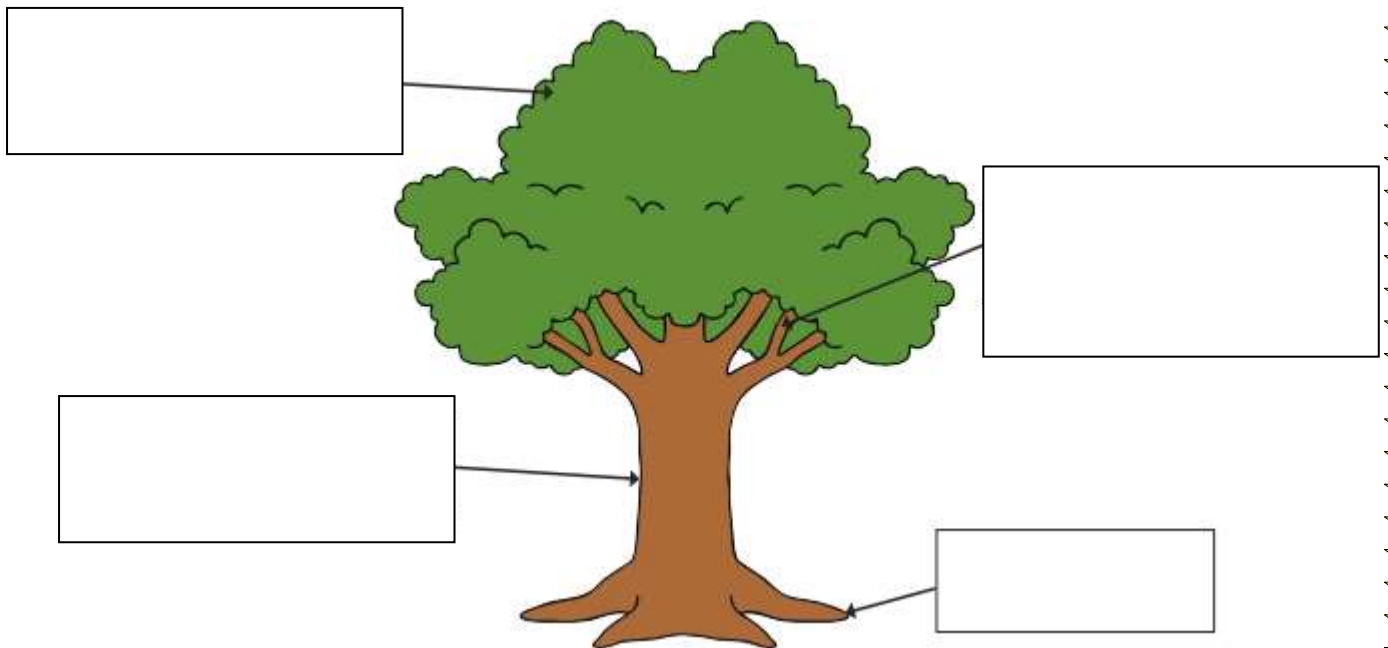
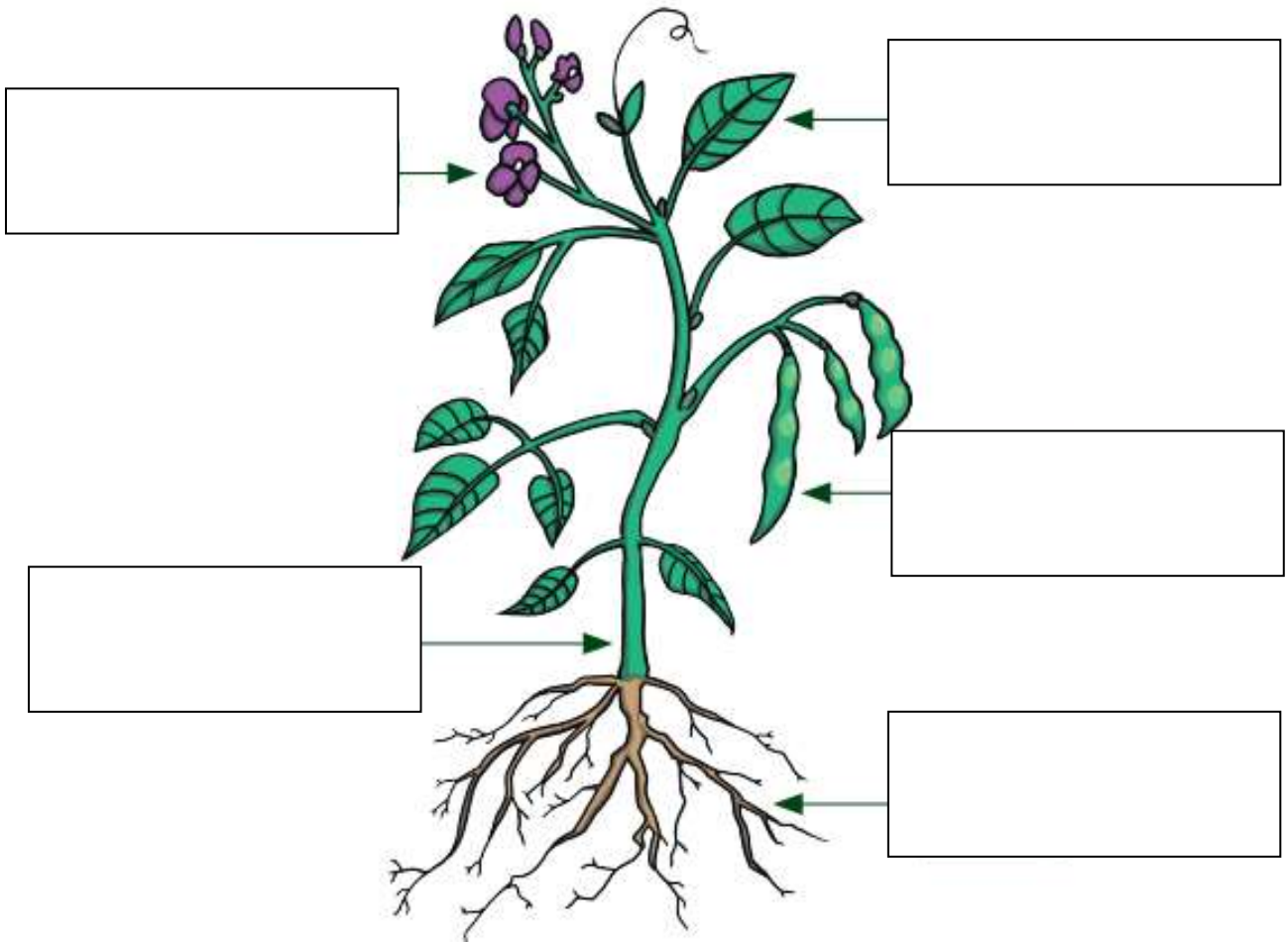

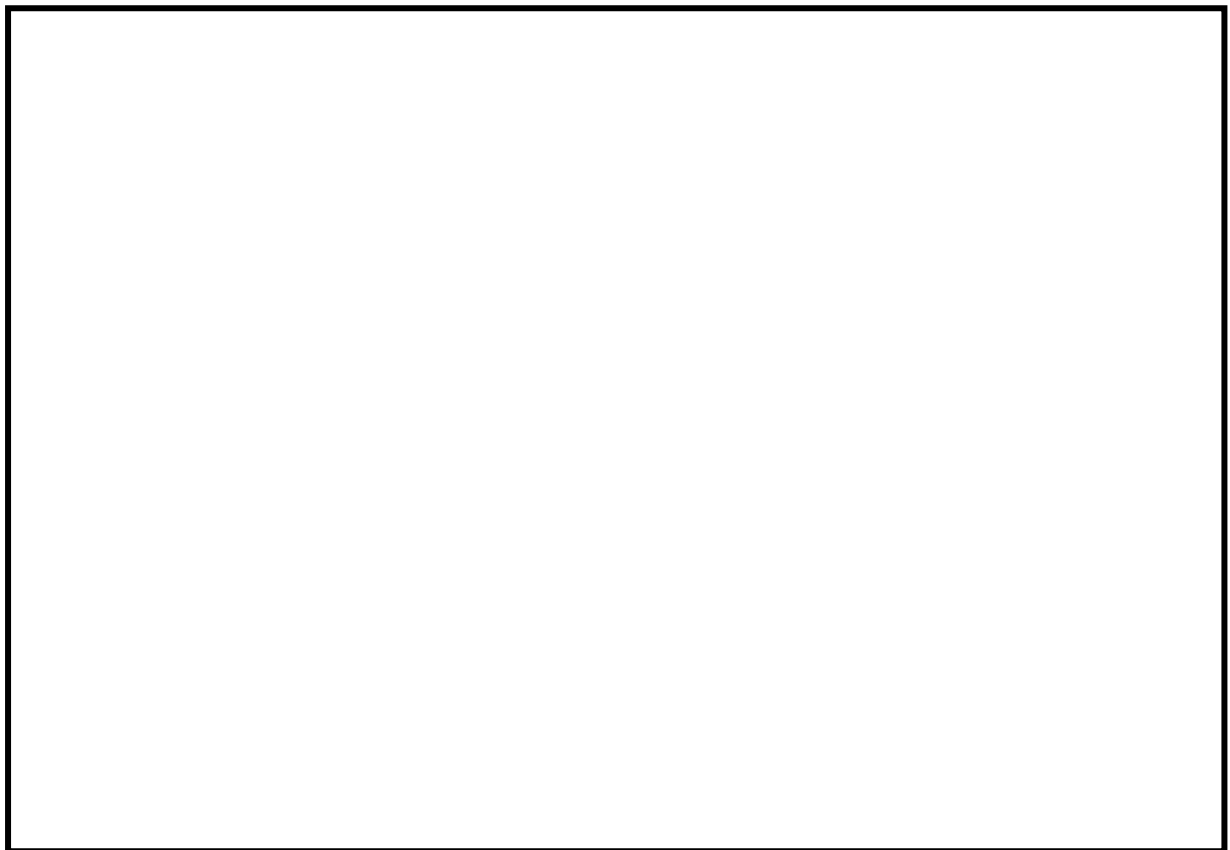

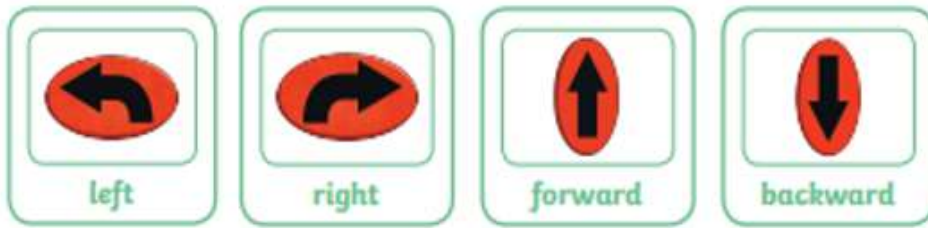
