Year 1 – Spring Term A

Key Question – What's it like in the United Kingdom?

Literacy Tree Texts – Izzy Gizmo/A walk in London



1) Geography

National Curriculum Objective – To name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas.

Key knowledge/skills – To identify and name the four countries within the United Kingdom. To name and locate the four capital cities and the seas surrounding the United Kingdom.

Activity – Children to colour the four countries of the United Kingdom their specified colour. Children to label the capital cities on the map and add the names in the correct location of the surrounding seas.

2) Science

National Curriculum Objective – To observe changes across the four seasons. To observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

Key knowledge/skills – To identify the typical weather associated within the four seasons of the United Kingdom. To associate environmental seasonal changes (leaves falling off of trees) with the typical weather expected at the corresponding time of year.

Activity: To create a circular piece of art depicting the typical weather expected in the four seasons within the United Kingdom. Answer the plenary questions below the artwork.

3) History

National Curriculum Objective – Children should be taught changes within living memory. Where appropriate, these should be used to reveal aspects of change in national life. Children should be taught about the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Children should be taught significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.

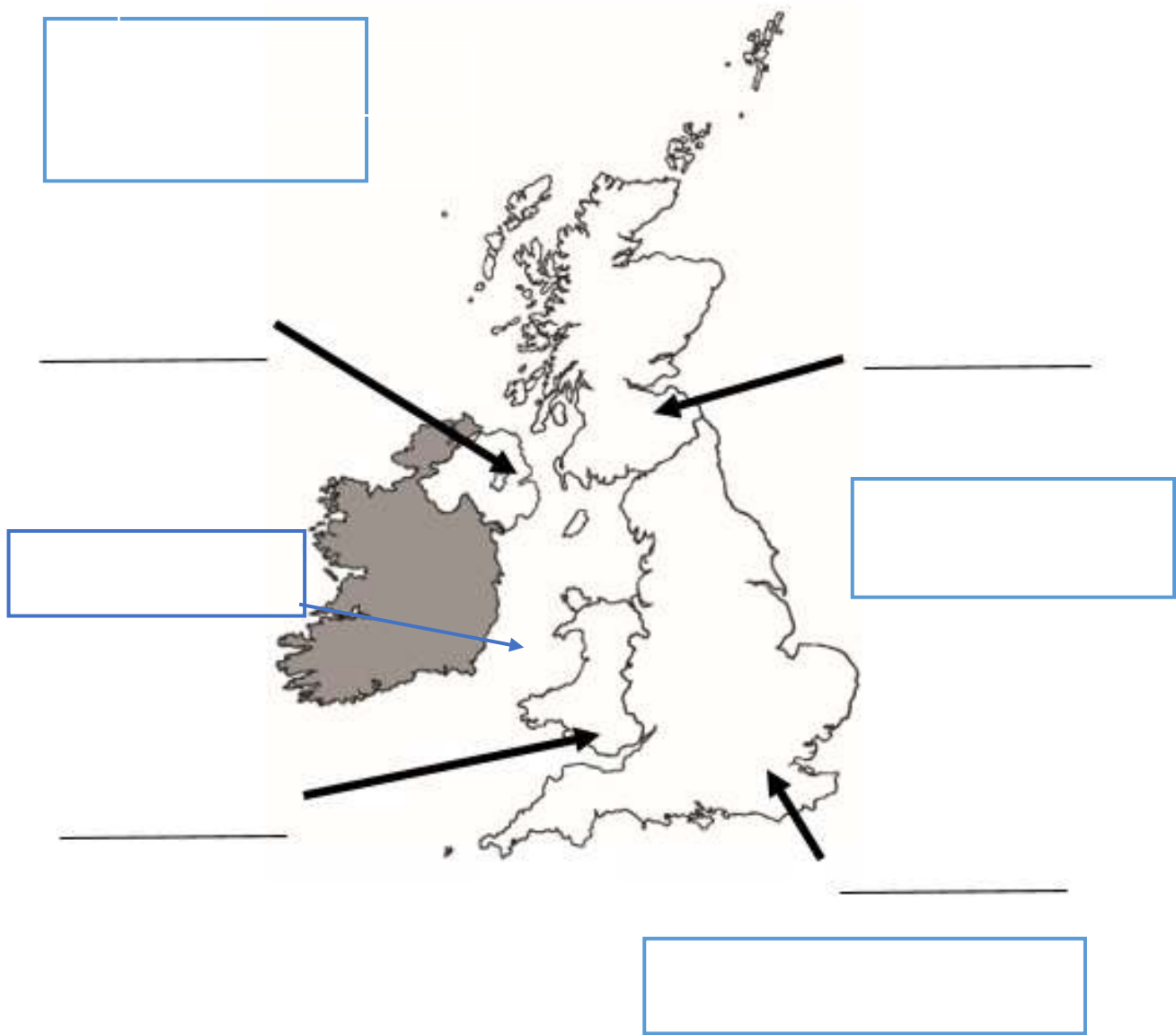
Key knowledge/skills – To identify Queen Elizabeth II from her photograph. To identify the year she was born and died. To identify who Queen Elizabeth II was married to and where she lived. To recall how many children she had and how long she reigned.

Activity 1– Queen Quiz. Children to answer multiple choice questions regarding significant elements of Queen Elizabeth II's life and death. To write one fact about Queen Elizabeth II not covered in the questions.

Key knowledge/skills – To identify significant features of Bridgwater Castle. To identify the River Parrett and recall its source and mouth.

Activity 2– Place labels from a list onto a picture of Bridgwater Castle. Name the river and answer the three questions.

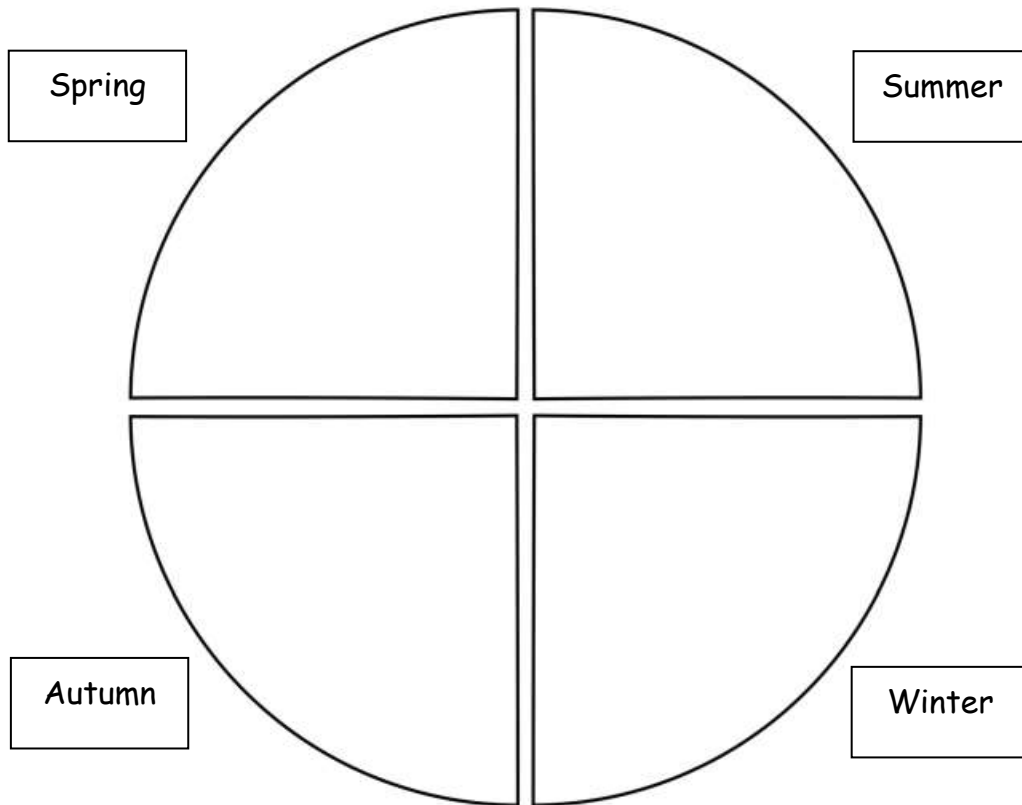
